### The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ.

Our theological reflections would say that there's a vertical dimension to the Eucharist, one that expresses the awe and reverence for the mystery confected in the sacrament. There is also the horizontal dimension wherein our lives are fueled by the Eucharist that consumes us each time we receive Communion. Some of us might tend to focus on one or the other aspect. "We must be completely free [of sin and worldly attachments] to belong wholly to Jesus Christ. Can I, in sincerity, say, 'Jesus is really living in me now?' Have I come to know Jesus in reality, not only in imagination? Externally, I might be very recollected and prayerful, but this counts for nothing, unless deep down you can see that Jesus is really there."

Rightly so, the Church offers us this Solemnity of the source and summit of our faith. It is a treasure far beyond human understanding. And yet it is a reality of Christian faith both intimately personal, and communally binding, one that is not confined to the laws of space and time yet operates there to give us a mystical foretaste of our eternal destiny. What we experience in Holy Communion, let's share with the world without hesitation or reserve ... not just on Sunday, but every day. Not just when it's easy or when I "feel good," but most especially when it's costly and difficult.

### **Cemetery Sunday:**

Traditionally Cemetery Sunday is the last Sunday of June. As we will not be able to hold the ceremony in the graveyard this year, Mass will be celebrated in the Church on Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> June at 3pm and will be offered for all who are buried in the cemetery. It may also be viewed on the church webcam. The 10 o'clock Mass in Kilbride will be offered for those buried in the cemetery. Public health regulations for attendance at Masses will apply.

# As the churches are open again for the congregations to attend Masses and we are asked to follow the guidelines for attendance at Masses and receiving Holy Communion:

Use hand sanitizer in the Church porches.

Facemasks are mandatory for attendance at all Masses.

Entry and exit will be through 4 doors, two at the back of the Church and two at the front.

There are four sections in the Church with 50 people allowed per section. You should sit beside family members and maintain a safe distance from other households.

Strictly no movement between sections before, during or after Mass.

When receiving Holy Communion, social distancing is of utmost importance. Please attend section by section and row by row <u>via the centre aisle and return by the side aisle</u>. Please wait until the priest or Minister of the Eucharist are in their place.

Please observe social distance at all times and take Mass leaflets home with you.

Please do not discard tissues in the Church as they are a major source of contagion.
